Introduction

The Museo Etnografico “Giovanni Podenzana” is one of the oldest sections of the Museo Civico della Spezia, established in 1873: it preserves, studies, displays and promotes local and non-European ethnographic material collected from the mid-nineteenth century onwards.

The Museum acts as a centre for research and dissemination on themes of anthropology and ethnography, with particular attention to the geographical area known as Lunigiana Storica, thanks to collaborations with institutions of national and international importance.

The non-European section includes artefacts from Africa, the Americas, Asia and Oceania that reached La Spezia thanks to explorers, sailors, scholars and travellers. Collected as ethnographic data, spoils of war or simple curiosities, these artefacts were meant to bear witness to encounters with distant cultures with which people had come into contact in various ways. In a period of just under one hundred years, from 1845 to 1936, weapons, ornaments, everyday utensils, furnishings and photographic images were purchased, stolen or received as gifts and subsequently became part of the rich museum collections of La Spezia.

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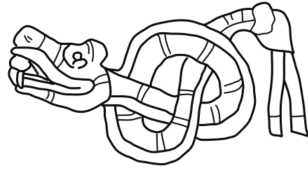
